Rector's Corner

Easter is more than Spring and it is Meant To Be Shared

I like Easter.... and I like everything about Spring. First there is the time of year itself..... This has been a very cold winter. I am tired of being cold. Feeling the sun on my face is pure heaven. I like looking at my wife's daffodils.... those things were quiet drab, mostly dead, little bulbs when she found them as a really good deal at the store..... and now they are bright, tall and colorful. Something from nothing.

Easter though is a more shocking celebration. It is more than just a cyclic experience of life from death in the usual places, like the garden. It is more than flowers and the renewal of life on a yearly basis. It is the staggering reality that death... <u>real</u> death.... is not beyond the reach of God to redeem it.

Before His crucifixion, people marveled at Jesus' teaching and miracles. But it was the Resurrection that truly proved who He is, and that He can be trusted with our very lives, because He is greater than death itself. The power of Easter really becomes visible in the stories of ordinary people of Jesus' empty tomb. Easter is about what that empty tomb means— or ought to mean— in our lives and the lives of those around us.

Christ's rising from the dead can mean very little these days to a jaded world that expects little beyond what it can see or reasonably predict. Stories of medical resuscitation, people awakening from comas, and our societal inoculation from the horror of death due to too many violent movies, all take their toll. Yet death is still death, and it means the same thing it has always meant. It means that life is over. The dead are missed and mourned by friends and family and, on this side of heaven, we know very little just what really lies ahead, beyond the grave.

Jesus had no chance whatsoever for a "near death" experience. He was crucified by the Romans who were known particularly for their skill and thoroughness, especially where inflicting pain and death was concerned. He died. He was deeply mourned and missed, especially by those who knew Him personally. But also by all who had begun to believe He was the long awaited messiah. His death was more than the end of a life, but also of faith. Without Jesus, hope itself had died. He had answered all the criteria for the Messiah, and if HE could die, then the Bible itself was a dead book, filled, to be sure, with lofty promises and wonderful stories. But little more than a wonderful fairy tale.

That His tomb was empty, the day after the Sabbath, did more than shake up His followers. And it did more than make his friends glad to see His face. It gave them back their faith...and their God.

People still need their lives changed, and God has proven that He can change them. There is so much death out there, especially these days, and Jesus alone is the answer. The first Christians knew who Jesus really is, because of Easter, and they told everyone they met what they learned from Jesus' resurrection: God really is alive.

Above all things, Easter is a community celebration. It is not a time for introspective self-evaluation, or even meditation on the things Jesus taught. Easter proves that God is real. He is life. In Him nothing can stand against us, not shame, fear, sin, or personal stupidity. We-- the Church-- need to invite people who are still in the dark and the death of this world to come in and find that God really has defeated death. Jesus rose from the dead for EVERYBODY. Easter is meant to be shared. Shall we?





The Daughters of the King is a religious lay order for women who are communicants of the Episcopal Church, churches in communion with it, or churches in the Historic Episcopate which today includes women in the Anglican Episcopal, Roman Catholic, and Lutheran (ELCA) churches. The order was founded in 1885 by Margaret Franklin at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in New York City. The members undertake a Rule of Life, incorporating the Rule of Prayer and the Rule of Service. By reaffirmation

of the promises made at Baptism and Confirmation, a Daughter pledges herself to a life-long program of prayer, service and spreading of Christ's Kingdom and strengthening the spiritual life of her parish. The St. Anne's chapter here at St. Stephen's has ten members that pray daily for our parish, community and country.

On April 6th at 10:00 am in the Parish Hall the fourth preparation study will start. The Study consists of twelve chapters that will prepare the student for becoming a Daughter. The St. Anne's chapter will be hosting a group from San Jose for the study after which they will form their chapter. This study session will be bilingual with Bishop Romero acting a translator when needed. The group will meet twice a month for approximately two hours each session.
